GENERAL INFORMATION

- Classes are generally ten weeks long unless otherwise noted (please see the calendar on the back cover). The fees for each class reflect the number of classes being held and all material fees.
- All-Day Primary children may only sign-up for classes that begin at 3:15pm. They may not sign up for Primary Half Day Classes at 11:45am.
- **Sorry, Toddlers may *not* participate in ASEP classes.**
- No classes will be held on school holidays, Staff Days, Conference Days, or when the school has been closed due to weather. For any other reasons, instructors will personally notify parents of class cancellations. If class is cancelled by an instructor, remaining classes may be extended, or a make-up class scheduled.
- Due to space limitations, there is only one ASEP class offered for half-day students on Fridays. Please note that the pick-up time for students enrolled in the half day ASEP class is 12:30pm. Half-day students are welcome to enroll in afternoon classes and return to the school campus at 3:00pm.

REGISTRATION

- Registration is on a first-come, first-serve basis. Registration forms will be time and date stamped as they are received. Registration for spring ASEP 2012 will be held Jan. 17-20.
- Classes fill quickly and we will not accept any registrations after Friday, Jan. 20. Some registration deadlines are extended if a class has not reached minimum enrollment requirements. Registration letters will be sent home via email the week of Jan. 23.
- **Please make checks out to the individual instructors/organization** whose names are listed after "Instructor" - NOT to MSD - and send them back to school with the completed registration form.
- Enrollment ages are firm! Please sign up for classes that are age/program appropriate. (Example: PRI/K 4-6 is a class offered for Primary and Kindergarten students ages 4-6 years old only.)

PROCEDURES

- All MSD Faculty will have class rosters for each class and will hand-off students directly to the ASEP instructor. All ASEP instructors also have class rosters and will keep track of attendance. Regardless of age, you will need to sign your child out with the ASEP instructor when you pick him/her up at the end of each class. Instructors will stay until all students have been released to parents.
- Class locations are indicated in this catalog and will be included in the registration letter. There will also be a class location map to the left of the Office door the week classes start.
- Classroom doors are kept locked and will be opened at the end of the class. Please do not arrive early and interrupt the class to be let in.
- **PLEASE PICK YOUR CHILD UP ON TIME!** Many of our instructors have other commitments after classes and it is very inconvenient for them to wait for tardy parents. Instructors may charge a late fee for late pick ups. Chronic tardiness could result in your child's exclusion from the class.
- **NO REFUNDS** will be given after registration is closed unless a class is canceled due to low enrollment.
- Feel free to send a snack for your child to enjoy before class.

● Future Zoologists

We are excited to welcome the Denver Zoo on campus for five diverse After School Enrichment Program classes offered to Upper Elementary students this semester. This is the perfect compliment to this year's Global Sustainability Futures Fair—*21st Century Zoo*. Our Elementary age Zoologists will participate in the following five sessions:

Colorado Alive

- Meet Colorado wildlife and perform hands-on investigations with horns, antlers, skulls, skins and more.
- Explore the interactions of living and nonliving components in Colorado's environments.
- Discover the importance of adaptations for life in Colorado's plains, mountains, and cities.

Raptors Revealed

- Dissect owl pellets in a hands-on lab to scientifically explore raptor diets.
- Meet an incredible live bird of prey.
- Discover the adaptive tools raptors have to be successful predators in their environment.

Endangered!

- Understand the concepts of endangered species and the terms *endangered*, *threatened* and *extinct*.
- Through activities and live animal encounters, understand why some animals are in danger of extinction.
- Use inquiry skills in an investigation to decide which animals are most important to save in a race to protect biodiversity.

Skullology

- Understand how scientists use inquiry skills to identify consumer categories (herbivore, carnivore, insectivore, omnivore) based on dentition.
- Identify and compare the structures of various skulls to determine their functions for individual species.
- Using the scientific method, observe skulls, collect data, and use dichotomous keys to identify a variety of animals based on their skulls.

Wildlife Science 101

- Gain hands-on experience with cutting-edge technology like radio telemetry to track animals in the wild.
- Understand the role of science in conservation while meeting live animals.
- Investigate career paths in the life sciences through interaction with zoo professionals.
